We are really looking forward to the kids' month-long school break. They arrive the end of March and return to Kenya the end of April. God certainly worked in the Kenya Presidential elections where there were very few violent issues unlike five years ago. Thanks to those of you that joined us in praying for this! This semester has been a busy one for everyone, especially Miriam. She not only turned 13 but had a speaking part in the junior high school play as well as taking part in the band and choir concerts. It was very hard for this Mom not to be in Kenya for these events!

Please pray for health. Even though it is the dry season, there have been many cases of Malaria, including Micah Joy and me.
