Frequently asked questions about our move to Kenya

When do you move? Paul's last day of Station Director is December 31. January will be a transition month. The plan is for everyone to be in Kenya early February.

Will the kids have a chance to say good-bye? YES!

Lord willing by the time you are reading this the kids are in Benin for their Christmas break. We will be doing a bit of traveling as well as hostessing in order to say goodbyes and bring closure. The kids fly back to Kenya early January to start school.



Where in Kenya will you be living? The goal is to live

within two hours of the airport and forty-five minutes of the Rift Valley Academy (RVA), where the kids go to school. There is not housing available near RVA so the kids will still be boarding. We are still small town dwellers at heart, hence we hope to avoid Nairobi. We have targeted Limuru and Naivasha as potential places, but we will see what God has for us.

What will Donna do? Donna's first priority is to be there for the kids. Those of you that know Donna well, know that she will be involved with children in some capacity. We will let you know what God opens up for her.

Who will replace Paul? That is a great question and we do not know the answer. There is a wonderful team on the ground here in Benin that already handles the daily operation. For now the Director of Africa Regional Support Services, Sharon Diehl, will be the interim Station Director. What about another engineer? TWR is pursuing a few options and we will see what the Lord does. If the Lord has been speaking to you about missions maybe now is the time to apply.

What about the NGO status and shortwave license? For those of you who have been following us through the years you know that neither of these has moved very quickly. Hence it is quite possible that these will continue to be slow processes. By God's grace, Paul is hoping to complete a few more steps on the NGO before leaving to help the transition be a bit cleaner.

Who will teach the Kennedy Children? Fiona will resume teaching her children. She would love for God to provide a teacher. Does anyone feel the Lord's leading to move to Benin?



What will happen to the Under the Mango Tree Kids Club? There is a wonderful group of leaders that God has provided over the last several years. Three Beninois are very committed to continue leading with the help of an expat. God has provided monetary funds to help with the cost for sometime into the future.

It is always exciting to have visitors come to Benin. In December Sid and Betty Kamp will be in Benin for the third Christmas work trip to Benin. They always bring a wonderful spirit, lots of laughter and strong backs. This year they are bringing a little extra (well, they are not quite bringing it and it is not little). TWR Canada has sent a 40-foot container with two new tractors, supplies and lots of other goodies. Sid and Betty were very instrumental in the project; they literally packed the container in the USA and hope to help unpack it here in Benin. Currently the container is traveling across the ocean on its way to Benin. Pray that there are no delays with shipping and everything goes smoothly with customs.

In addition to Sid and Betty, we are welcoming Brian Martin to Benin. He has worked with TWR in Guam and will be joining the Benin team for six months. Brian is a diesel mechanic so we are very excited to have him. Please pray for Brian as he seeks the Lord for direction after his six months in Benin are done.
